A big thank you to L and K for co-chairing Event Planning. It is a very difficult job, especially with rising food and venue costs, an 18-20% service charge and a 7.5% tax. Many ideas to cut costs have been discussed, from let's just have coffee and pastries to serving boxed lunches. However, room charges will still cost \$200 to \$500 per event. These are the facts! Please let us know if you have a contact or an idea for a venue. Some have suggested that we give up the luncheons, but I don't believe our group would survive without the luncheons. Look what happened during Covid. We lost 50% of our membership. However, we are getting back to our pre-Covid size with many new members.

Sadly, as President it is my job to talk business. I thank you for listening. Enjoy the fall weather and don't forget to set your clocks back on November 3.

From the Parliamentarian:

Newcomers has been working on streamlining our Bylaws. We took the first step with the amendments in May and June. We changed the fiscal year to the calendar year. The next step is to make other amendments that were explained at the September meeting.

- Since we decided not to further pursue an IRS designation of 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization, the language is changed to reflect our current 501(c)(7) designation.
- Committees have been renamed as Standing and Operational.

There were no inquiries or requests for copies of the amendments. At the October meeting a vote was taken to adopt the proposed amendments.
